

BOOK IN A BAG, AN ENVELOPE, AN OATMEAL BOX

First, select a book report container. The container could be a paper bag, a manila envelope, a can, or anything else that might be appropriate for a book. Decorate your containers to convey some of the major details, elements, or themes found in the books.

Next, work on the contents of your containers. Include the following:

- **Questions** Write ten questions based on the book. Five of the questions can be about general content, but the other five must require more thinking.
- **Vocabulary** Create a ten-word glossary of unfamiliar words from the book.
- **Things** Include five things that have a connection to the story.

The final part of the project is the student presentation. In the presentation, you must explain the connection of the container to the story, conduct a show and tell about the five things, and then share information about three of the book's literary elements -- setting, characters, conflicts, climax, or resolution.
